



## BORDEAUX : EXCLUSIVE CHÂTEAUX



### CHÂTEAU PEYROULET

In the same family for 6 generations. Out of respect for the product and the consumer, the Fouilhac family has opted for sustainable vine-growing methods. There is grass cover between the rows, but the soil surface directly under the vines is cleared. As part of the estate's ecological approach, the manure is organic.

- Bordeaux red
- 50% Merlot, 50% Cabernet-Sauvignon
- Average production of 1,500 hectolitres
- Clean, brilliant colour,
- A fine, nicely-developed wine, robust and fruity



### CHÂTEAU MOULIN DE PRAYÈRE

The red vines at Château Haut Florin stretch to the north-east of Sauveterre de Guyenne: the soil is very uneven and the subsoil is composed of iron and clay.

- Bordeaux red
- 70% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 20% Merlot Noir, 10% Cabernet Franc
- Dark colour
- A beautifully balanced wine with Cabernet-Sauvignon character, plenty of body on the palate and silky tannins



### **CHÂTEAU GRAND CLAPEAU OLIVIER**

On a gravel hilltop in the Haut-Médoc, the highest in the area of Blanquefort, near Bordeaux.

- Haut Medoc – Cru Bourgeois
- 55% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 45% Merlot
- Average production of 60 barrels
- A magnificent garnet red colour
- A generous, fleshy wine with a fine bouquet



### **CHÂTEAU LE CÈDRE D'ARTHUS**

In Saint Sulpice de Faleyrens, to the west of Saint Emilion, 1.44 hectares farmed by hand

- Bordeaux Supérieur
- 40% Cabernet Franc, 30% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 30% Merlot
- Average production of 8,000 bottles
- Dark, garnet red colour
- Bouquet of fallen leaves and truffles
- A warm, generous, robust wine



### **CHÂTEAU MOULIN DE BRION**

In Couquèques, to the north of Saint-Estèphe, on clay-silica-limestone soils and a fossil-rich limestone and sedimentary rock subsoil

- Medoc – Cru Bourgeois
- 75% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 25% Merlot
- Average production of 150,000 bottles
- 15 months in barrels
- Colour between ruby and crimson
- Supple and full on the palate, showing off its ripe fruit, flower and spicy flavours
- A youthful, well-born Médoc.



### **CHÂTEAU GRAND SOUSSANS**

On the hilltops of the hamlet of Tayac, in the best gravel soils in the whole of Soussans

- Margaux
- 65% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, 5% Petit Verdot
- Average production of 26,000 bottles
- 25% in new barrels
- Delicate aromas and great finesse. Can be enjoyed right away or kept to make the most of its good ageing potential.
- Rich in colour with a discreet hint of wood and red-fruit flavours. No trace of astringency when young.



### **CHÂTEAU MALESCASSE**

Château Malescasse was built in 1824 and its wine has been renowned since the 19<sup>th</sup> century as one of the best in the village of Lamarque

- Haut Medoc – Cru Bourgeois
- 55% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 35% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Franc
- Average production of 150,000 bottles
- Traditional maturing in oak barrels, of which 30% new
- A nicely-balanced bouquet of fruit and wood
- Full and long-lasting, will be all the better for two to three years in the cellar to mellow it out to perfection
- 2005 vintage: 1 star in the Hachette Guide 2009



### **CHÂTEAU LAMARSALLE**

Estate on clay-limestone slopes, sometimes with stones

- Montagne Saint-Emilion
- 80% Merlot, 10% Cabernet-Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc
- Average production of 36,000 bottles
- Brilliant ruby-red hue
- Red-fruit bouquet evolving into liquorice, vanilla and truffle scents
- Generous and supple with good tannins



### **CHÂTEAU LA ROSE BOUQUEY**

9 hectares of ancient sand and gravel soils

- Saint-Emilion
- 80% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Franc
- Average production of 75,000 bottles
- A dark, clear colour
- An elegant, spicy, powerful bouquet
- Nice dense wine with rich, fleshy tannins



### **CHÂTEAU HAUT PONTET**

A 5-hectare vineyard on the doorstep of Saint-Emilion

- Saint-Emilion – Grand Cru
- 90% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Franc
- Average production of 28 barrels
- Matured exclusively in barrels, of which one-third new
- A lovely deep red colour
- A bouquet full of charm with harmonious floral Merlot hints and woody touches from the nicely-balanced maturing in oak.
- Noble, elegant tannins on the palate endowing the wine with a very special personality.
